It has a realistic plot so real that it is unreal. After reading this book, I am truly amazed how reality trumps fiction. Author Niki Savage has written a book (fiction) that defies the imagination. Most readers simply find themselves unable to suspend disbelief. The fiction in this book, it seems, trumps reality. The plot seems to be fantastical, unbelievable. But let's be clear about something. Real life is made up of real people who do really strange, stupid, and irrational things. It is amazing how reality trumps fiction. For example, if you were a lawyer would you fall in love with a murderer and a rapist? Not me. I wouldn't. You wouldn't either, would you? But there is a lawyer (ex-lawyer) in New Zealand who did just that. She fell in love with a murderer and a rapist (the murderer and rapist is the same man). Would you get engaged to a person who held you hostage in a bank robbery for five (5) days? Not me. I wouldn't. You wouldn't either, would you? Nobody can bond so deeply with a bank robber, could they? You're not going to believe this, but believe it or not, "Yes We Can." In 1973 that is exactly what happened. It is known as "Stockholm Syndrome": (Quote) "On August 23rd, 1973 two machine-gun carrying criminals entered a bank in Stockholm, Sweden. Blasting their guns, one prison escapee named Jan-Erik Olsson announced to the terrified bank employees The party has just begun!
