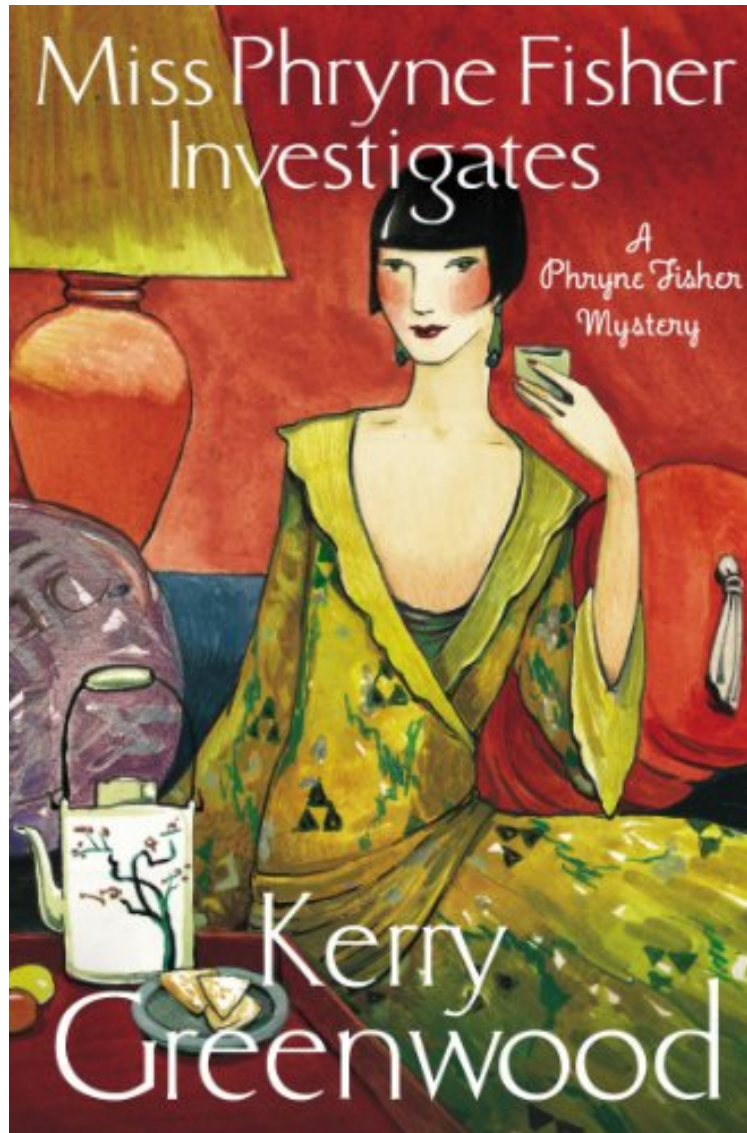

 Es handelt sich hier um den ersten Band der Phryne Fisher Serie, die mittlerweile vom australischen Fernsehen verfilmt wurde und dort gerade als Fernsehserie läuft. Aus den vielen, vielen, Murder Mysteries stechen Kerry Greenwoods Bucher durch die Wahl einer witzigen Protagonistin hervor, deren Ecken und Kanten ungeschliffen bleiben, wodurch sie für den Leser greifbarer wird. Insgesamt solide Arbeit und Unterhaltung. Man kann gar nicht anders, als die dekadente Detektivin auf eigene Kosten, die auf Regeln pfeift und z.B. illegal einen Revolver mit sich rumschleppt, sympathisch zu finden.  
 Einzige Mankos: Der Plot könnte etwas ausgefeilter sein und manchmal zweifle ich sehr, da es in Australien in den 20-ern wirklich so hoch hergegangen ist wie in Chicago. Nachdem Phrynes Persönlichkeit einmal ausgebreitet ist, könnte man sich in der Serie allgemein auch mehr auf den zu lösenden Fall konzentrieren, als auf die langatmige erneute Schilderung ihrer Eskapaden (wechselnde junge Liebhaber, Fahren mit dem Sportflitzer, Phryne als Fliegeras, ...), die knapp am Klischee vorbeischnappen.

Phryne fans will relish the chance to see how beloved characters like Bert, Cec, Dot, and Inspector Robinson wandered into Phryne's life, and newcomers will enjoy getting to know ultrafashionable Phryne, who's wealthy enough to do whatever she wants but whose previous poverty has created a strong empathy for the working class. In Melbourne to investigate the mysterious illness of the daughter of a family friend, Phryne stumbles into a case involving two of the 1920s' signature evils: cocaine and back-alley abortions.
