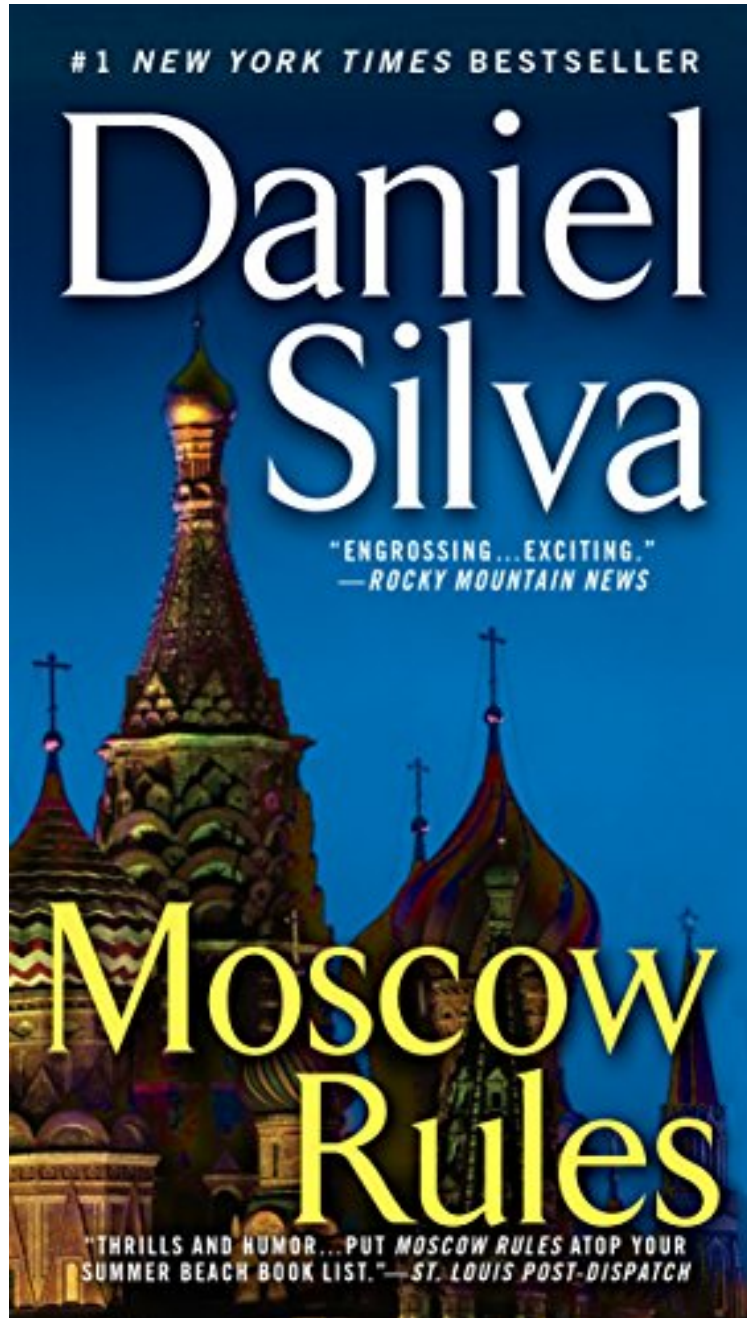

Yet the author does not really play in this league. His personalities are sketched with a fibre pen, while Greene and LeCarre use brushes.Silvas perspective on the conflicts in the background of his spy thriller are very simplified, black and white. The Israeli are just plain good, the Palestinians are just plain terrorist. Compare this with the delicate perspective of "The Little Drummer Girl" from Le Carre.The book gets suspense, particularly in it's last third. However, the story is not always logical. Sometimes the author needs to use the rabbit out of the hat to get his story running again. You feel he had a movie in mind when writing it. "Moscow Rules" is like a good cheeseburger for lunch. At points though, I felt it went way too slow - too much talking and not enough action. For people who are supposed to be government agents, I felt they were plodding around too much when in reality they would be kicking down doors and knocking heads together. Lastly, there were one or two things about the ending I took issue with. I don't want to say what because I don't want to spoil it for those who haven't read the book but I felt the ending didn't really do the book justice 100%.
