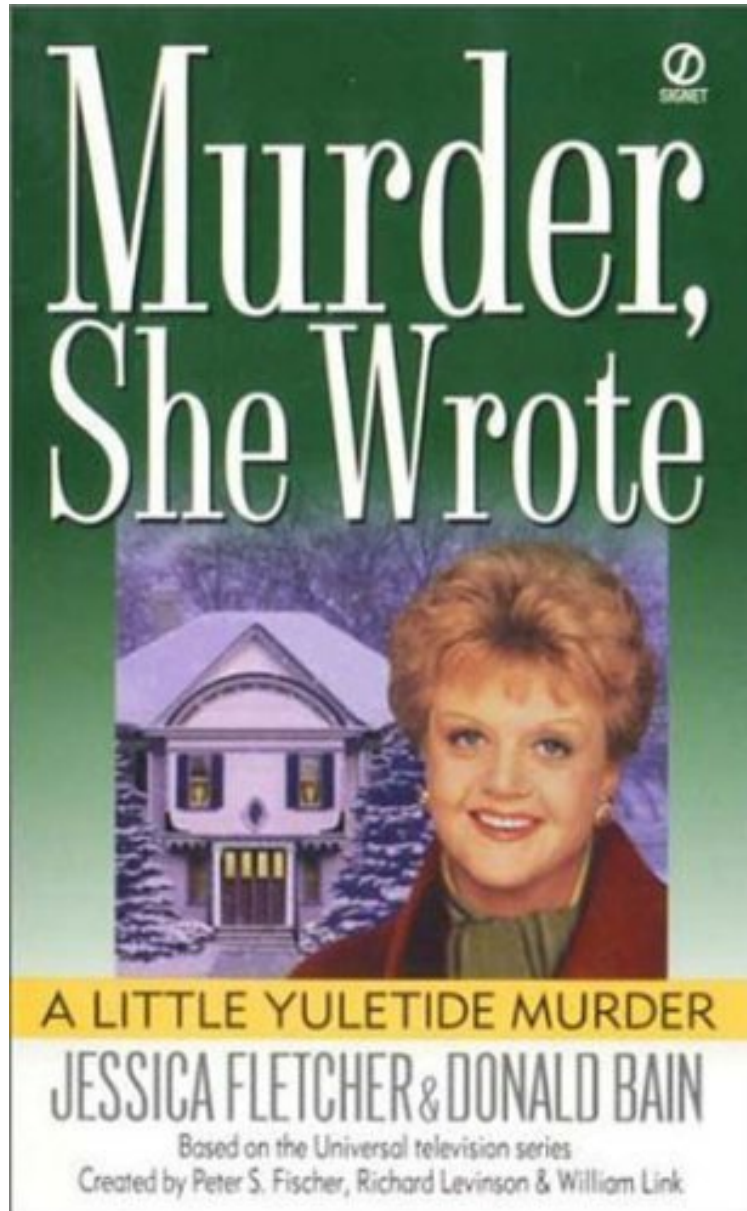

With one noted exception, the immediate suspect in everyone's mind is Maine's year round Scrooge, Jake Walther, a lunatic with a temper, who was known to loathe the victim. However, there is one person who thinks that maybe the wrong individual has been falsely accused of murder. Jake is in luck for that person is Jessica, who begins to seek the underlying reason that Santa was killed. The tenth novel in the ever popular "Murder She Wrote" series, A LITTLE YULETIDE MURDER, is a well written New England cozy in which readers know exactly what they are going to get since there are no surprise twists. It is sort of like going to McDonalds where the customer knows what the burger will taste like regardless of location. Still, the charm of this novel and its predecessors is that the characters and story lines remain true to the TV series. Though several TV movies are expected over the next couple of years, fans of Ms. Fletcher will find the novels are a superb replacement for the canceled weekly show.

I began with "Yuletide" simply because holiday mysteries set in small snowy villages have always appealed to me. In terms of setting and plot, I was not disappointed. What I appreciate the most about novels based on television shows is the tremendous amount of information readers get about familiar characters. For instance, we learn about some of Jessica's habits when she's home in Cabot Cove: her favorite way to walk around town, her ability to strike up conversation with her neighbors, and what foods she enjoys and doesn't enjoy! We even learn the first thing she does when entering her home. Above this, what was particularly striking was the flavoring of regional vocabulary. As a writing teacher, I was bothered by the half-dozen or so "typos" that appeared throughout the edition I read. Such sloppy editing from such an acclaimed mystery writer is simply unacceptable. I'd suggest, Jessica, that you get a new editor! Otherwise, Bain's style, superbly reflected through the first person point of view, is easy and quick. I'm looking forward to reading other novels in the series--hopefully sans typos!
