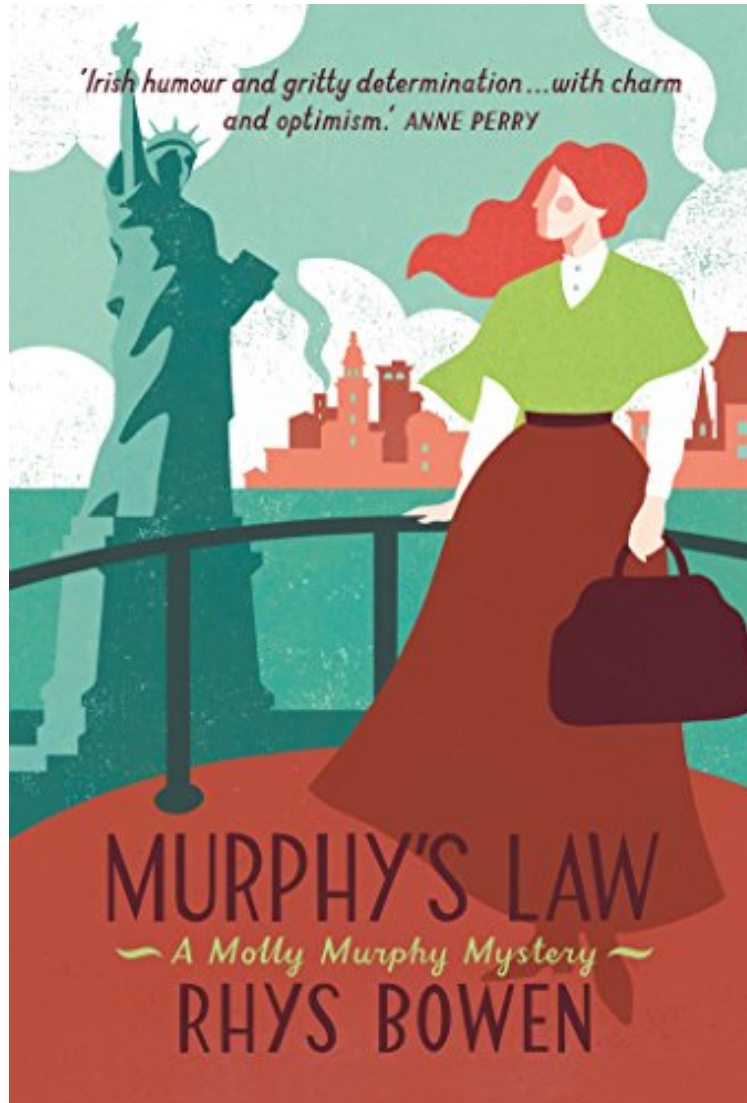

Molly investigates quite a bit on her own and gets into serious trouble and the lead investigator in this case, has to help her out...Molly Murphy is an enjoyable, feisty heroine with an interesting background. She has a big mouth which gets her into trouble often and has always been one for big dreams. Captain Daniel Sullivan is a handsome "Black Irish" counterpart to Molly. Thus I very much enjoyed the parts of the book dealing with immigration and integration in the "New World". Very authentic descriptions.Molly is a person who reacts to the twists and turns of her life. Changes are sudden, unplanned and not entirely satisfying. When she does think about a direction for her life, she quickly lets herself be sidelined by other events.The plot makes a travesty of justice and rationalizes corruption. I might have "swallowed" this in a medieval setting... Or maybe my problem is that I am not a red-haired Irish patriot...
