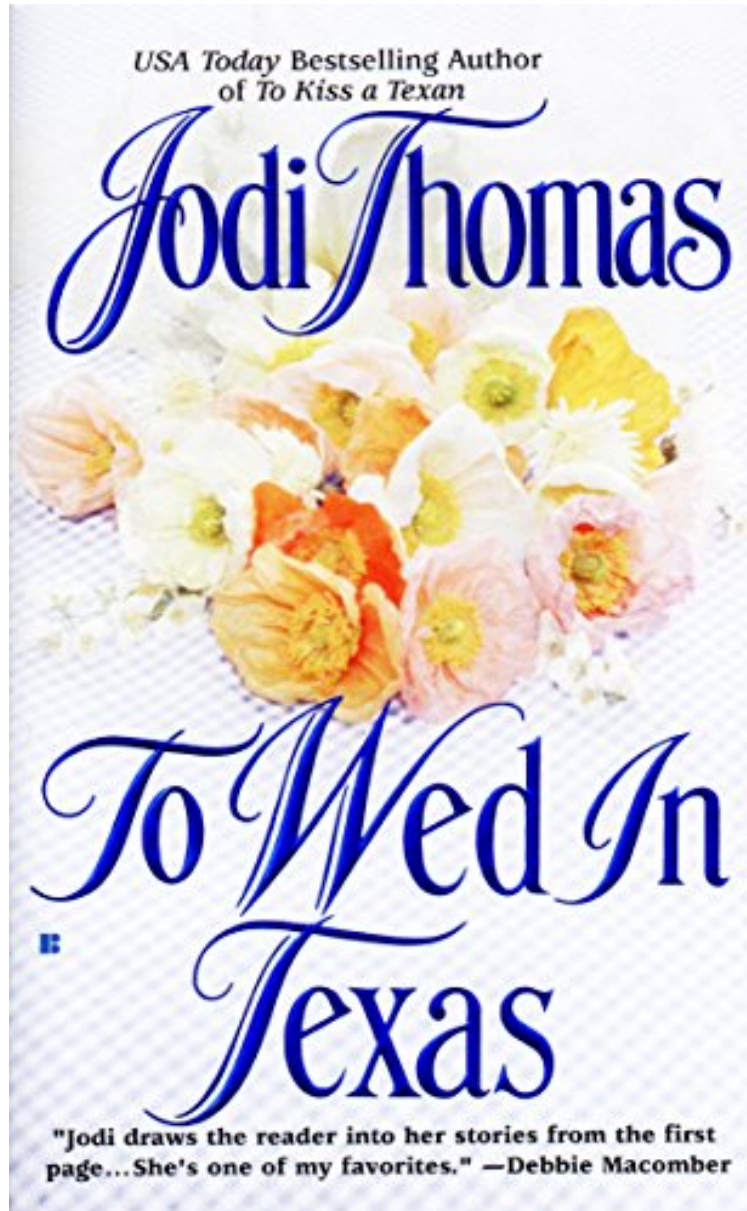

The first chapter of this gentle romance will capture you and draw you into a warm, charming, and sometimes harrowing read. Daniel McLain is a man of God, raising his twin girls in the newly-developed and dangerous town of Jefferson, Texas. When he appeals to his family for help, Daniel expects a family member to arrive and help him. What he doesn't expect is a distant cousin who's travelling companion is "bad luck." Upon arriving on a steamboat in the most unusual way, Karlee learns that although the Civil war is over, there are those who still want to fight, and endanger lives. Pleasing her employer and keeping the three-year-olds safe isn't going to be easy. Ms. Thomas has written her characters so well that as I read I found instant compassion for Daniel and the girls.
